Sounds like fun, huh? Sounds like the plans you have for the upcoming four-day weekend? Go to the river or four-wheeling with your friends and family, sitting around the campfire enjoying the soft summer evening. Or even just a barbecue in your back yard, kids running around screaming and playing, and maybe even splashing around in the swimming pool. What makes it all even better is that underlying feeling of peace and security that we Americans have been blessed with, thanks to the foundations of our great nation.

That's certainly the atmosphere in which I grew up. We had deep appreciation for our country. We felt chills when we saw our flag flying proudly atop the flagpole or in a parade.
